ACT PHN's social workers in general practice pilot will be delivered and evaluated through the After Hours funding until 31 December 2023 to measure the impact of the program on patients, practices, and the broader health system. The program was extended to run until 31 March 2025. Continuation of this innovative model of care will incorporate the findings from the evaluation to further support people in navigating appropriate services. It will assist in further following up and supporting people who may unnecessarily access the ED and the social workers will also provide direct client services aligning with General Practice multidisciplinary team-based approach. Learnings from this pilot will be used to support sustainable approach for the model and ability to expand pilot to other General Practices.
