#### Aim of Activity \*

The aim of this activity is to increase access to low intensity mental health services to achieve:

- Increased access to services early in illness and episode
- Improved clinical outcomes early in illness and episode
- Reduced wait times for high intensity services/services for moderate to severe presentations

#### **Description of Activity \***

As part of the NextStep program, an evidence based low intensity service model is in place, delivered by a service provider commissioned in 2017. The model is targeted at providing services to people with mild to moderate symptoms of depression and anxiety.

Low intensity interventions are cognitive behavioural therapy based, with a strong focus on guided self-help. Structured interventions are delivered through telehealth and face to face by a trained non-clinical workforce, who receive intensive ongoing clinical supervision. The workforce is trained to ensure that services that are delivered are appropriate for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse groups.

Additionally, ACT PHN, through the implementation of the Joint Mental Health and Suicide Prevention Regional Plan, will support system integration and community-based activities to improve access to low intensity mental health services. This includes

integration with Medicare Mental Health and the National Early Intervention Service, prioritising health promotion and prevention of distress at a community level, and upskilling general practitioners and primary care to enable them to facilitate coordinated care for people with low intensity needs.

#### **Description of Activity \***

As part of the NextStep program, ACT PHN commissioned a service provider to deliver evidence based mental health services for children under 12 and their families in a stepped care approach with Interventions provided in the form of:

- structured group programs, including Cool Kids (7-12 years) and Cool Little Kids (3-6 years) to address anxiety
- individual psychological interventions provide by experienced psychologists.
- focused psychological strategies to individuals between the ages of 0-12 years with a priority on children aged 8-12 years, inclusion of family members or carers as required, comprehensive assessments and structured treatment plans.

In addition, ACT PHN will continue to deliver the ACT Child and Youth Mental Health Alliance, in partnership with the ACT Office

for Mental Health and Wellbeing and the Youth Coalition of the ACT. The Alliance provides an opportunity for sector and workforce coordination and capacity building and enables system and service improvement and integration. The Alliance will support system integration and community-based activities to strengthen health system responses for children under the age of 12, including prevention of mental ill-health and distress, improving service accessibility and responsiveness, building workforce capacity to recognise the needs of children and provide approrpiate care, supporting parents and carers, and delivering early intervention support.

#### **Description of Activity \***

Under this activity, ACT PHN will continue to commission a suite of services tailored for identified groups that have:

- Barriers to access
- Limited community-based treatment options

ACT PHN has also commissioned a new model of care targeting ACT's vulnerable populations. This model of care focused on LGBTQIA+ people, aged 16 and over and provides both low intensity and high intensity interventions. As a priority psychological interventions include comprehensive assessments and structured treatment plans, and offer a range of evidence based culturally sensitive interventions not just for this who identify themselves as LGBTIQA+ but also for those uncertain of how to identify themselves. In addition, ACT PHN will ensure that these services are well integrated with tertiary and secondary services to ensure that duplication is avoided, and that individuals or groups of people are not missed.

"To commission high intensity intervention-based services, including psychological interventions.

To ensure that primary mental health care services for people with severe and complex mental illness are well integrated with secondary and tertiary services and avoid duplication.

To coordinate services for people with moderate to severe and complex mental illness, to reduce fragementations and reduce the impacts of the 'missing middle'.

To build capacity of the ACT mental health workforce and primary care workforce in recognising and responding to the needs of people with severe and complex mental illness. "

#### **Description of Activity \***

As part of the NextStep program, ACT PHN will continue to commission the Next Step High Intensity service to provide high-intensity CBT services to people with severe mental illness. ACT PHN will continue to work with the existing provider to deliver this service. A portion of this service, specifically for youth has been expanded.

Clients with severe and complex mental illness may at times receive treatment services through the hospital system or through Adult Community Mental Health, thus strong integration with primary mental health services needs to occur to avoid duplication of service delivery and ensure the best outcomes for shared clients. As part of the primary mental health stepped care model,

clients will be supported to step up to tertiary services or back down to primary care services.

Additionally, ACT PHN, through planning and implementation of the Joint MHSP Regional Plan, will support system integration and community-based activities to strengthen health system responses to people with severe and complex mental illness,

including reducing fragmentation between services and building capacity of the workforce.

#### **Description of Activity \***

ACT PHN has commissioned headspace centres in Canberra. Both headspace centres in Canberra will offer the following services to young people between 12 to 25 years of age:

- Mental Health Counselling- delivered by qualified mental health practitioners offering time-limited, evidence-based counseling services
- Online and phone support headspace has a range of ways to support young people both online or by phone. Young people can get support for their mental health by simply creating a headspace account.
- GP- support to address physical and sexual health issues as well as mental health consultations by a GP skilled in working with young people
- AOD supports- support to address issues with Alcohol and other drugs delivered on-site by our partner (Directions Health)
- Individual placement and support program (IPS) provides in-person, one-on-one support for work and study goals. IPS

Vocational Specialists will collaborate with a young person's mental health worker to ensure the support they receive helps them achieve their goals.

- Peer support access to a trained peer worker, who uses their own experiences of a mental health issue to provide support and role modeling as well as linking with services and supports both within headspace and the community
- Care Coordination- support to link with the services and supports in the community that can support recovery
- Family Supports- individual and group interventions that can support families and friends to more effectively support their young person's recovery
- Volunteering- an opportunity for young people to join the Youth Reference Groups and work with other young people to inform service delivery in the centres and deliver community activities
- Community Engagement- a range of community development and education programs delivered in partnership with other agencies across the Canberra region

ACT PHN will commission an Early Psychosis Youth Service (EPYS) in the ACT, leveraging off local headspace services. The aim of this activity is to reduce the incidence and severity of psychosis within the community through prevention, early detection, reduced risk of transition to full-threshold psychosis, restoration of normal development and functional trajectory, coordinated care delivery, and minimisation of the impact of psychosis.

#### **Description of Activity \***

ACT PHN commissioned an EPYS (headspace Early Psychosis) in the ACT, to be integrated with the existing headspace Canberra service and delivered in line with Orygen's EPPIC model.

This activity will provide services to young people aged 12-25 who are actively experiencing, or are at ultra-high risk of, a first episode of psychosis. The key overarching feature of EPYS is that it will provide easy access to care, an integrated biopsychosocial approach, and a high level of partnerships with service providers.

The headspace Early Psychosis program supports young people in every aspect of their recovery, including best practice treatment, education and employment support and managing relationships. The service will deliver mobile assessment and treatment, continuing care and functional recovery and will be integrated with existing services in the ACT.

ACT PHN commissioned a property consultant to lead consultations with local stakeholders on the requirements for a local EPYS site and to ensure the site is fit for purpose for all stakeholders.

#### **Description of Activity \***

ACT PHN will recruit a Program Officer - Mental Health and Suicide Prevention, to support the Mental Health and Suicide Prevention Manager with the coordination, engagement and integration of suicide prevention activities across regional stakeholders.

ACT PHN will partner with local stakeholders to develop and implement a Suicide Response Protocol that informs coordinated action and community support and response following a death by suicide in the region.

ACT PHN will continue to coordinate the ACT & Region Suicide Prevention Community Collaborative, a multi-sector network of individuals and organisations who are committed to supporting community-led and systems-based suicide prevention in the ACT. The Collaborative will be responsible for informing community-based suicide prevention, intervention, and response activities and initiatives for the region, including supporting grants and pitches to ensure a community-led approach to TRISP initiatives.

- -Provided reporting to DoHAC on a quarterly and annual basis as a progress summary for the training activities and matters associated with the activities. The IAR- position ceased on 30th June 2025. ACT PHN is committed to supporting IAR-DST implementation via communication and awarness raising to the primary care providers and will continue to direct IAR related quries to the e-learning modules, & National Support Project led by Central Eastern Sydney PHN.

- AOD supports- support to address issues with Alcohol and other drugs delivered on-site by our partner (Directions Health)
- Individual placement and support program (IPS) provides in-person, one-on-one support for work and study goals. IPS

Vocational Specialists will collaborate with a young person's mental health worker to ensure the support they receive helps them achieve their goals.

- Peer support access to a trained peer worker, who uses their own experiences of a mental health issue to provide support and role modeling as well as linking with services and supports both within headspace and the community
- Care Coordination- support to link with the services and supports in the community that can support recovery
- Family Supports- individual and group interventions that can support families and friends to more effectively support their young person's recovery
- Volunteering- an opportunity for young people to join the Youth Reference Groups and work with other young people to inform service delivery in the centres and deliver community activities
- Community Engagement- a range of community development and education programs delivered in partnership with other agencies across the Canberra region"

The Tuggeranong Medicare Mental Health Centre offers a welcoming, low-stigma entry point to accessing advice, consultation, information, initial assessment, and service navigation. The centre is staffed by a multidisciplinary team including psychologists,

mental health assistants, and social workers.

The Tuggeranong Medicare Mental Health Centre will also engage with the community and stakeholders to increase awareness of supports, promote help-seeking, improve understanding of mental health and social & emotional wellbeing, reduce stigma, and enable referral pathways and system integration.
